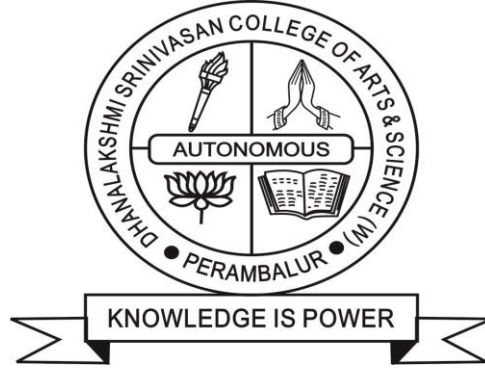

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The academic year is divided into two semesters.
2. The semester fee shall be paid by every new student on admission and not later than the 15th working day of each semester by the seniors.
3. For every payment, a receipt will be given and it must be available with the students until completion of degree.
4. If the semester fee is not paid within the date prescribed, the student's name will be removed from roll.
5. A re-admission fee of Rs.1000/- should be paid, if the student wants to continue her studies.
6. If a student discontinues or leaves the college during the course term, she shall not have the right to claim any portion of the fee.
7. Holders of Scholarship are bound by all the foregoing rules.
8. If fees are paid by draft, it must be drawn in favor of Dhanalakshmi Srinivasan College of Arts and Science for Women payable at Perambalur. Bank commission will be charged for out station D.D. Cheques will NOT be accepted.
9. On any account, Hostel Fees will not be adjusted towards college semester fees.
10. Students who have got detained in any one of the semesters must get permission from the Registrar of Bharathidasan University.
11. Counsellor meeting will be conducted on every Fridays.

GENERAL INFORMATION

SCHOLARSHIP

1. Fee concession according to the Government regulation may be applied for and the application should be accompanied by a statement of income of parent or guardian. Students from Scheduled Caste / Tribe and Muslim minority must submit a Certificate from a revenue officer, not below the rank of a Deputy Tahsildar.
2. Grant of Scholarship from the Government of India and the State Government is admissible to the students, only when sanction orders are issued by the appropriate Revenue authorities. The College is not responsible for the grant or non-grant of Government Scholarships. All students are expected to pay their dues to the college irrespective of orders issued by the Government.
3. The Scholarship money will be disbursed to the students only after money is actually paid by the Government to the Principal and if students and parents have signed in the prescribed registers and submitted the Xerox copies of fee receipts.

ATTENDANCE

1. Regular attendance is compulsory. Attendance will be taken at the beginning of each class.
2. Late-comers will not be admitted to the class room without informing to the department and Physical directress. The Physical directress will keep a record of late comers and regular late comers will not be excused.
3. Leave application should be submitted in advance to the HOD. Leave application must be attested by the Parent / Guardian or by the Warden in the case of inmates of the hostel.
4. In case where absence is due to unforeseen causes an application for leave should be submitted on the day of return to the college, duly signed by the parent.
5. A student who applies for long leave on grounds of illness must attach a medical certificate along with her application.
6. A student who is absent without leave even for one period will be marked as absent for half a day.
7. Attendance certificate required for the Semester examinations will be issued only when,

- (a) The students' progress and conduct have been satisfactory.
 - (b) A student must secure 75% attendance in each semester.
8. If a student is absent for three days without information / permission her name will be removed from the Roll.

LIBRARY RULES

- Library is open to readers from 8.00 am to 8.00 pm on all the working days and 10.00 am to 1.00 pm on all the Sundays and semester holidays.
- Readers should leave their personal articles (Like bags, purses, note books, book and files) and foot wear in the property room.
- Readers should scan their library Identity card while entering and leaving the library in the scanner kept at the gate counter.
- Perfect silence should be maintained in the library.
- Reference books, Back volumes, Projects, Magazines and Journals will not be issued.
- Books will be issued against the member's Library Identity card.

7. Books should be handled with care.
8. If a library book is damaged or lost, the person responsible should replace it with a new copy or should pay double the amount of the cost of the particular book.
9. No one is allowed to sub lend books.

11. UG students are entitled to keep a book for one week from the date of issue. PG students are entitled to keep a book for two weeks from the date of issue. Research students are entitled to keep a book for one month from the date of issue.
12. If the book is not returned on or before the due date, a fine of Rs.1/- per day including holidays will be levied. The student will not be allowed to use the library till the fine is paid and the book returned.
13. Avoid misplacing the books in a bookshelf.
14. Reprographic services are provided to users from 10.00am to 5.00pm on all the working days and 10.00 am to 4.00 pm on holidays.
15. Internet facility can be availed by users from 10.00 am to 8.00pm on all the working days and 10.00 am to 4.00pm on all the semester holidays.
16. A fine of Rs.25/- will be charged for the replacement of a library members identity card.

GENERAL DISCIPLINE

1. Every student should dress decently and appear smart.

5. Students are not allowed to leave the classrooms during the class hours

Every student has to carry out a project work and shall submit at the end of the fourth semester.

The medium of instruction and examinations shall be in English except for courses on languages other than English.

2. Choice- Based Credit System (CBCS)

The Credit System is introduced at Dhanalakshmi College of Arts and Science for Women (Autonomous), Perambalur from 2005 – 2006 pertaining to the norms within the frame work of the norms of the Tamilnadu State Council for Higher Education. The minimum credit points to earn for the respective degrees are as follows:

(CIA) and the (ii) Semester Examinations (SE). A student has to pass the CIA and SE separately to complete a course.

4. Shortage of Attendance – Condonation & Re-do semester

Students who have not earned 50% of attendance during the first semester cannot continue the Programme in the second semester and they may apply for re-admission to the Programme in the next academic year.

5.Semester Examinations Arrears

Students, who fail in any course(s) in the Semester Examinations, can appear for the course(s) in the subsequent Semester Examinations. However candidates who have arrears in practical shall be permitted to take their arrear practical examination only along with the regular practical examination in the next respective year.

6.Non – Submission of Project / Dissertation

All postgraduate students will submit their Project Reports at the end of the final semester, as part of their curriculum requirements. For any reason, if a student is not able to submit her project report, she can appear for the viva-voce at the end of the subsequent academic year.

7.Disciplinary Action for Malpractice

Malpractice by students during the Internal Tests and Semester Examinations will be viewed seriously. All reported cases of malpractice during Internal Tests, Semester Examinations in Theory and Practical's, Project Viva-Voce, Field Work, Internship etc. will be referred to the Principal. The Committee will enquire the candidate in the presence of her parent/s and take an appropriate decision regarding the punishment to the candidate. The decision taken by the Committee will be final and binding. Students, found guilty of malpractice, will be debarred from writing three consecutive years of Semester Examinations.
